### EU Referendum and Environmental Concerns

Basingstoke Transition Network (BTN) is minded not to “take sides” on the question of on EU exit. However, we are very concerned that the environment is not mentioned in the “Leave EU” statements on the websites of our two neighbouring MPs (Kit Malthouse and Ranil Jayawardena). We believe that the topic is a very important factor that people should consider in their choice in the EU referendum.

Indeed, we would go further and suggest that few issues are more important than protecting the world in which we live. Even more importantly, we would wish to consider the welfare of generations – hopefully – to follow.

Given your high-profile activities within the Basingstoke Sustainability Forum and on the protection of the River Loddon and the fact that such efforts relate very closely to the principles of the European Water Framework Directive, we see this as just one very simple example of where cross-border agreements become very meaningful.

We need hardly highlight the importance of dealing with the massive health implications of atmospheric pollution (as recently reported, an estimated 40,000 premature deaths in the UK alone from poor air quality) and that such pollution is no respecter of national boundaries.

We appreciate that at present you are setting out your case, but would like you to encourage this consideration by mentioning your view on environmental protection if the UK were to exit from, or remain in, the EU. Whichever way the referendum decides, any such statement by you will heighten people's awareness of the issues. We believe that this would be consistent with your support for the Basingstoke Sustainability Forum.
